The range of services offered by the Visitor Centre of the Donau-Auen (Danube Floodplains) National Park includes guided tours on land or water and various other attractions, such as an interactive multimedia exhibition of the wetlands, an observation tower with thematic exhibits, or a visitor shop with a selection of souvenirs, printed materials, or equipment for the local outdoor tours. A spectacular presentation of diverse local habitats, flora and fauna may be enjoyed on the so-called Castle Island with its unique underwater observatory.
